- Tentatively planning on going to Dublin for observing either September or October.
- We watched a short video on "Whats up for June" highlighting observing targets of the month.
   We also watched a short video on "Tonight's Sky: June 2018" from the Hubble Space Telescope YouTube Channel.
- Club Viewing Reports: Bob observed Jupiter and the great red spot on June 8th.
- July presents some great observing opportunities:
  - July 1st 11:30pm the moons of Saturn; lapetus, Dione, Enceladus, Tethys, Rhea and Titan will be viewable in Sagittarius.
  - July 3rd & 4th Mercury is in cancer next to the Beehive cluster at Magnitude 0.0 visible with naked eye at 7 degrees for 45 min after sunset along with Venus in Leo at Mag –4.3.
  - July 27th & 28th Uranus (at 5.8 mag) and Neptune (at 7.8mag)will be viewable with binoculars pre dawn.
  - Jupiter will be viewable all month at -2.2 mag. in Libra.
  - Mars in Capricornus, closest to earth since 2003 will be better viewed at the end of July when it rises at sunset at -2.8 mag.
