- \* Observatory work: At this time completing the observatory Vinyl siding of the north and south peaks is on hold, but looking to tackle it sometime this year. The second step is a little loose and needs attention. Perhaps a 2"x4" attached to the riser. Downed branches in the driveway and field from the winter storms were picked up by Bruce Norlund two weeks prior to the meeting.
- \* A work day to remove brush and small trees on the west and south walls needs to be scheduled. A 2" X 2" X 20' transition strip on the south side of the observatory is rotted and needs to be replaced or protected in some way to prevent further damage. Also the rubber flap on the north east side has a tear that needs to be repaired.
